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### Parents of Dual Credit Students

Dear Parents,

Valley City State University is offering high school students the opportunity to take dual-credit college courses where students may get credit for high school and college. To enroll, your student must meet the minimum GPA requirement and test scores for some courses. Dual Credit classes are real college classes and therefore, students will receive only semester grades that will appear on their official Valley City State University transcript. (and their high school transcript)

This handbook will provide information for you and your student to select dual credit coursework to meet anticipated college career pathways. The pathways have been designed to reduce potential duplication of course requirements and select a potential focus area for their college career.

When considering dual credit enrollment, parents and students should review the following options:

- Taking 6 or less courses in specific content areas of general education
- Completing the College Studies Certificate 8 courses (24 credits)
- Completing the full General Education Block 13 to 16 courses (39 or more credits)
- An Associate of Arts pathway may also be available 60 credits

Dual credit coursework serves as both high school credit and college credit, which can provide your student with an accelerated path to college, saving time and money. The courses are conveniently offered on the high school campus (unless otherwise noted).

#### **Application and Approval Process**

#### **Application Process**

- Your school will provide a list of acceptable dual credit courses that align with VCSU and the dual credit program.
- Student applies for college admission, completing college application for enrollment. This is turned in to the student's college.
- Students who qualify for free and reduced meals should fill out the Bank of North Dakota Dual Credit Form and mail the completed form to: Bank of North Dakota, PO Box 5509, Bismarck, ND 58506-5509.

#### **Entrance Requirements**

A 3.0 cumulative GPA is required to be admitted. Colleges use the ACT (preferred), SAT, COMPASS, PLAN, or CollegeBoard Accuplacer scores for student dual credit placement in English and Mathematics. Scores for admittance are:

#### Accuplacer Testing

Your high school is administering the Accuplacer. Please contact the high school counselor for information on how to register for an exam.

- Cost for first Accuplacer test: \$12. Pay with credit card through <u>VCSU Dual Credit Accuplacer Store</u>.
- Cost for second Accuplacer test and retakes: \$12 per test.
- Computer, pencils, and scratch paper will be provided.

A printout of scores will be provided immediately after the test is completed. No calculators, cell phones, jackets, calculators, computers, notes or other sources of outside information are allowed in the testing environment. Students will be asked to leave these items in a secured area before testing.

#### Grades

- The grade reported on the high school transcript will be identical to the grade reported on the college transcript.
- A high school operating under a weighted grading scale may assign a higher point value to the grade for calculating GPA but may not assign a higher grade to the course.

A student enrolled in a dual credit class (college class for which a student receives both high school and college credit) is enrolled in a COLLEGE class. All policies relative to attendance, curriculum, grading, etc. are determined by the college. The geographical location of the course (college campus, ITV, high school classroom, online/computer, etc.) may not pose justification for deviation from the college regulations and policies.

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#### Eligibility and Assistance Highlights

To be eligible, a student must:

- Be a current sophomore, junior or senior attending a North Dakota high school, or student completing a North Dakota home education program.
  - 2. Receive authorization from high school to take approved dual credit course.
  - 3. Qualify for free or reduced price lunch.
- 4. Submit application for assistance to BND during the course enrollment process.

Costs covered by assistance:

- 1. Application fee (if applicable)
- 2. Tuition and fees
- 3. Books (with shipping costs, if applicable)
- 4. Assistance will be reduced by waivers or other assistance student receives.
- 5. Student may not receive assistance to retake a course.

#### Instructions and Application Process

- 1. Student attending a North Dakota high school work with a school official and/or or parent/guardian to complete the application.
- 2. Student completing a North Dakota home education program work with a parent/guardian to complete the application. To verify eligibility, submit the first two pages of parent/guardian's federal tax return.
- 3. Important: Complete all fields for course(s) taken or processing will be delayed!
- 4. Submit application for assistance to BND during the course enrollment process and meet the fall, spring and summer submission application deadlines to BND (see below).
  - Fall January 31\*
  - Spring June 30\*
  - Summer September 30\*

\* Note: If the deadline date falls on a weekend, the Friday prior to that date is the deadline date.

- 6. After applications are received at BND, student will be sent notification of approval or denial for assistance.
- 7. The college campus will be notified to bill BND directly for application fee, tuition, fees and books less waivers or other assistance.
- 8. All assistance will be paid directly to the college campus through which the dual credit course is being taken. In the event of an overpayment to the college, any funds will be returned to BND.

#### Assistance is not a loan; therefore, approved student will not be asked to repay funds.
