SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES and STRATEGIES

2023-2024

This booklet lists scholarship information received by the VCHS Counseling Center. Application deadlines may change from year to year, so check the VCHS daily bulletin often for the newest scholarship details.

Online databases with additional scholarship opportunities are also listed on the last page. Other scholarship information is available at the VCHS Resource Center, public library, and at college websites. Your family should check with employers for awards available to children of employees, and with area fraternal, professional and community service organizations for their scholarship opportunities. No list is complete, so check a variety of sources.

When looking for scholarship information, do not limit yourself to a specific major, but also check related areas. For example, majors related to business could include accounting, banking, finance, economics, business administration, or marketing.

Use these guidelines when applying for scholarships:

- 1. Make sure you meet the scholarship requirements.
- 2. Apply early so you will not miss the deadline.
- 3. Read all the directions <u>before</u> you begin.
- 4. Complete the forms neatly. Type the application if possible. Neatness does count.
- 5. Check your work for spelling, grammar, and punctuation errors. Correct errors neatly.
- 6. Have your work proofread.
- 7. When asking for a written recommendation, allow plenty of time for your writer. Also give your writer the scholarship criteria and a summary of your activities.
- 8. Ask your writer if their recommendation may also be used with other scholarship applications.
- 9. Include all necessary materials with the application. If you include copies of newspaper articles, awards, or other materials, they should be of good quality.
- 10. Keep a copy of your application information to use as a reference for additional scholarships.
